Divine Providence: Looking Back to See God's Loving Plan Unfolding


 I attended the 1971 Youth Summer Study Program of the Kosciuszko Foundation, New York City, at the Jagiellonian University in Krakow, Poland.

 In 1972, I attended the Summer Study Program of the University of Kansas at the Adam Mickiewicz University in Poznan. Like the previous year, I spent several weekends with Dr. Andrzej Brożek visiting the Silesian parishes, their cemeteries, and ancestral villages looking for my relatives and ancestors.



 These two summer courses gave me the self-confidence to organize and do the following: In the early summer of 1973, by God's design, I led the first-ever group of Texas Silesian Polish back to the "Old Country" to visit Poland and especially a 4-day visit with ancestral relatives in the villages of our Silesian ancestors. Now, thanks to the presence of several priests from Poland locally, especially Monsignor Frank Kurzaj, (1-830-216-7706), trips to Poland and to our Silesian villages are available annually and have produced much fruit. These have established a prophetic "bridge" between Silesian Poland and Texas. Thank you, Lord, the intercession of our Blessed Mother, Polish saints, and deceased ancestors!

A MEMORIAL TRIBUTE TO OUR SILESIAN POLISH IMMIGRANT ANCESTORS

The Panna Maria Haritage Center Foundation was established by Binhop John W. Yaota, the first Blakey and descendant of the first Silenian Polish interigrants to Datas, to recognize and calebrate the first Polish artifement in the United States at Panna Maria, Taras in 1854. The Panna Miria Heritage Center will relate the story of the Silenian Polish interigration to Texas, and the subsequent "Polish Remismans" that began in the late 1960s, to rekindle a new generation's interest in Polish and Silenian heritages. The stories will serve as a mirror to reflect the kistory of our nation and will act as a less to force on the meaning of faith, family, and economoity. The Center will be built in Panna Maria, Taras, and will include the britage of the Silenian Polish artifiers and their descendants from the original Catholic Parishes including Panna Maria, Centeleswa, Koncienko, Bandera, Inse, St. Hertwig, Falls City, Yashtawa, San Antonia, Meyenwille, Las Gallinaa, McConk, and White Deer.

The mission of the Panon Maria Haritage Center is to retain for posterity the values, beliefs, and traditions of the first Silesian Polish action, and their descendants, and will implie, angage, inform, and adapties all visitors. The further goal is to keep Silesian Polish curbons, beliefs, and values vibrant and relevant in today's constantly changing cultural environment. The 16,000-square-foot Haritage Center facility will be a destination for facility, educational groups, ackelers, recenters, and transition and will include permanent and temporary exhibit space, a theeter, an archive, a generalogy room and areal birtary collection area, a likency and conting man, event space, and a gift shop and concention area.





Kosciusko or more properly spelled Kosciuszko was named for the Polish General Thaddeus Kosciusko when it was established March 12, 1880 by sixty-five Polish families. In 1892 a Polish Catholic school was built. The first Church was built in 1898. The people gathered together and with \$2,000 built the first Church and named it St. Ann. The wooden church measured 80ft x 40ft.

A Parish for the Polish Immigrants and then the neighborhood St. Michael Catholic Church Celebrates 150 years in 2016

Twelve years after Silesian Polish immigrants arrived in San Antonio, they received ecclesiastical permission to establish a parish. It was the year 1866 which was their way of also celebrating the 900th Anntversary of Polish Christianity and the beginning of the Polish nation, St. Michael was chosen for its name and it became the third oldest parish in historic San Antonio.

It began with the arrival of Father Vincent Barzynski of the Resurrectionist Order who was the earliest resident pastor. On November 8, 1866, the first Mass of the newly organized parish was celebrated in the San Fernando Cathedral. St. Michael's divine services were initially held in a rented one-story, rock building owned by Emanuel Rzeppa.

In 1867, Rev. Barzynski wrote to Father General Kajsiewicz from San Antonio: "It is true that the population of my parish amounts to some 44 to 50 families ... the total number of people under my protection ... comes to about 250 ..." The first church was constructed in 1868, and five years later, St. Michael's School was opened.

[°] Father Vincent Barzynski was transferred to Chicago where a large number of Polish immigrants began to arrive. In 1874, he became the pastor of St. Stanislaus Kostka Parish, the first Polish church in Chicago. He became the most influential dominant leader of Chicago's Polonia until his death in 1899.

The first native born Texas priest, Rt.

Rev. Monsignor Thomas Moczygemba, was pastor of St. Michael's for 48 years – 1912 to 1960. His assistant, Msgr. Edward Dworaczyk succeeded him.



In 1922, the original church was torn down and a larger edifice of white brick was erected. The cornerstone of this majestic church was laid on July 4, 1922, followed by the dedication on October 25, 1922. The blessing of the beautiful stained glass windows took place on December 2, 1923.

The parish thrived with a grade school and even a high school. In 1947 St. Michael's was changed from a national parish to a territorial (neighborhood) parish in the Polish Quarter that was changing as many Polish residents had moved to the new suburban areas in a growing San Antonio.

This historic church was demolished in 1968 and the Polish Quarter vanished to make room for Hemisfair 1968. The beautiful stained glass windows were put into Immaculate Heart of Mary Church located in the western part of downtown San Antonio. St. Michael's cemetery, located a couple of miles away from the Church, still exists but accepts no new burials.


