POLISH HERITAGE CENTER at PANNA MARIA



The Poliak Heritage Center at Panna Maria Foundation was established by Bisbop John W. Yanta, the first Bisbop and descendant of the first Poliah Sikarian immigrants to Texas, to recognize and celebrate the first Poliah settlement in the United States at Panna Maria, Texas in 1854. The Poliah Heritage Center will relate the story of the Polish immigration to Texas, and the subsequent "Polish Remainsance" that began in the late 1960s, to rekindle a new generation's interest in Polish and Polish Silenian heritages. The stories will arrve as a mirror to reflect the history of our nation and will act as a lens to focus on the meaning of finith, family, and community. The Center is being built in Panna Maria, Texas, and will include the heritage of the Polish settlers and their descendants from the original Catholic Parishes including Panna Maria, Centohowa, Kosciusko, Bandera, Inez, St. Herwig, Falls City, Yoskinwo, San Antanio, Meyerswille, Las Gallinas, McCook, and White Deer.

The mission of the Polish Haritage Center is to retain for posterity and keep vibrant and relevant, the history, values, helicfa, contours and traditions of the Polish actilers and their descendants at the first and oldest permanent Polish actilement in America, and to inspire, rangage, and educate our visitors. The 16,500-square-foot Heritage Center facility will be a destination for families, relevantimal groups, scholars, researchers, and tourists and will include permanent and temporary exhibit space, a theater, an archive, a generalogy room, reveat space, and a gift shop and concession area.



Kosciusko, or more properly spelled Kosciuszko, was named for the Polish General Thaddens Kosciusko when it was established March 12, 1880 by sixty-five Polish families. In 1892 a Polish Catholic school was built. The first Church was built in 1898. The people gathered together and with \$2,000 built the first Church and named it St. Ann. The wooden church measured 80ft x 40ft.

St. Michael Catholic Church

Twelve years after Polish-Silesian immigrants arrived in San Antonio, they received ecclesiastical permission to establish a parish. It was the year 1866 which was their way of also celebrating the 900th Anniversary of Polish Christianity and the beginning of the Polish nation. St. Michael was chosen for its name and it became the third oldest parish in historic San Antonio.



It began with the arrival of Father Vincent Barzynski of the Resurrectionist Order who was the earliest resident pastor. On November 8, 1866, the first Mass of the newly organized parish was celebrated in the San Fernando Cathedral. St. Michael's divine services were initially held in a rented one-story, rock building owned by Emanuel Rzeppa.

In 1867, Rev. Barzynski wrote to Father General Kajsiewicz from San Antonio: "It is true that the population of my parish amounts to some 44 to 50 families ... the total number of people under my protection ... comes to about 250 ..." The first church was constructed in 1868, and five years later, St. Michael's School was opened.

⁶ Father Vincent Barzynski was transferred to Chicago where a large number of Polish immigrants began to arrive. In 1874, he became the pastor of St. Stanislaus Kostka Parish, the first Polish church in Chicago. He became the most influential dominant leader of Chicago's Polonia until his death in 1899.


The first native born Texas priest, Rt. Rev. Monsignor Thomas Moczygemba (pictured above left) was pastor of St. Michael's for 48 years - 1912 to 1960. His assistant, Msgr. Edward Dworaczyk succeeded him.

In 1922, the original church was torn down and a larger edifice of white brick was erected. The cornerstone of this majestic church was laid on July 4, 1922, followed by the dedication on October 25, 1922.

The blessing of the beautiful stained glass windows took place on December 2, 1923. The parish thrived with a grade school and even a high school. In 1947 St. Michael's was changed from a national parish to a territorial (neighborhood) parish in the Polish Quarter that was changing as many Polish residents had moved to the new suburban areas in a growing San Antonio.

This historic church was demolished in 1968 and the Polish Quarter vanished by Urban Renewal to make room for Hemisfair 1968. The beautiful stained glass windows were put into Immaculate Heart of Mary Church located in the western part of downtown San Antonio. St. Michael's cemetery, located a couple of miles away from the Church, still exists but accepts no new burials.




