Annual Report of the Members in the Region of South Texas

San Antonio

Our Lady of Sorrows, 3107 N. St. Mary's St., offers a Polish Mass. This church also offers Mass and Rosary in Polish every first Saturday at 7 pm. Since September 1986, Our Lady of Sorrows has been the base of operations for the spiritual care of Polish immigrants, known as the Polish Catholic Mission. St. Michael's Catholic Church was the first Polish church in San Antonio. It was razed for Hemisfair '68 and rebuilt nearby. A few blocks away, Our Lady of Sorrow proudly features the exquisite stained-glass windows from the original St. Michael's Church!

Seraphic Sisters Shrine to Our Lady of Częstochowa, and Divine Mercy Chapel in San Antonio, at 138 Beethoven St. It includes a beautiful chapel and museum providing opportunities for adoration and retreats. Visiting priests are often needed for Mass; please contact Sister Emilia at 210-337-8193 for more information. Mass is held on Saturday and Sunday.

The Leopold Moczygemba Foundation

The Foundation continues to offer annual scholarships to youth through an essay contest. The FLMF actively promotes the heritage left to us by Fr. Leopold Moczygemba and the pioneering Silesian settlers who came to Texas in 1854 and settled in South Texas.

In 2025, the Foundation held the Annual Gala at Kosciuszko Hall with several hundred attendees.

The organization maintains two websites, FLMFoundation.org and a vast and beautiful website – SilesianTexans.com, which focuses on Silesian-Texans' histories, including priests, religious, families, and parishes. The site is professionally presented and researched.

Bandera

Panna Maria, PHC Open Jubilee Year with Mass, Celebration Honoring Ancestors

The Christmas season of 2024 marked the 170th anniversary of Panna Maria, the oldest permanent Polish settlement in the United States. The Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary Church in Panna Maria, which is one of the Jubilee pilgrimage sites in the Archdiocese of San Antonio, celebrated the opening of Jubilee Year 2025 on Dec. 29 with a special evening Mass and a candle light tribute to the first Mass celebrated in Panna Maria on Christmas Eve, 1854, under the oak tree that still stands next to the church.

Special guests at the celebration were a delightful group of young singers, dancers and musicians, Zespół Majeranki from Rabka, Poland, who performed during Mass, during the candle vigil and finally, before the front doors of Immaculate Conception Church.

The evening also celebrated the 30th anniversary of the ordination of Bishop John W. Yanta, whose family was among those original Polish immigrants and who was the first Bishop to come from that immigration. So it was fitting that the evening was capped with a reception and dinner at the Polish Heritage Center, which was founded by Bishop Yanta, and is dedicated to preserving the history of the first immigration of Texas Polonia.

Veterans Exhibit Opens

On November 30, the PHC opened its newest temporary exhibit, which honors Polish veterans from the original immigration who fought in America's wars. Curated by Librarian/Archivist Lauren Robinson, the exhibit shows artifacts and memorabilia including documents, letters, uniforms and pictures from the Civil War through the War on Terror.

Dziękuję Celebration

The PHC celebrated its friends and donors on December 7 with its annual Dziękuję event, which featured a reception, raffle and Polish dinner served family style by Apolonia Catering.

School Tours

Educating future generations about the trials and triumphs of our immigrant ancestors is a foundational goal of the Polish Heritage Center. During the months of November through May, nearly 1000 students from Karnes City, Falls City, Poth, Runge, Stockdale, Yorktown, and Nixon toured the Center and historic sites in Panna Maria.

White & Red Gala and AllDęte

The Polish Heritage Center hosted its second annual White and Red Gala on March 1, 2025 at the Panna Maria Hall. More than 300 people attended this annual fundraiser, including several members of the PACT Board of Directors.

The musical entertainment for the Gala was provided by AllDęte, a Polish brass band of nine members. They spent five days in Panna Maria, visiting with community members (and some Banduch relatives), performing at Falls City Schools, meeting longhorns, playing cowboys, shooting music videos, accompanying the Panna Maria choir at Sunday Mass, and playing tourist on the River Walk. It was a wonderful cultural exchange that left everyone with new friends and great memories.

Texas Polonia Youth Day

Texas Polonia Youth Day was successfully launched at the Polish Heritage Center in Panna Maria on April 12 with more than 250 participants - Elementary, High School, College and University students, faculty advisors, and accompanying parents and grandparents. This event was a true fulfillment of Bishop Yanta's vision of a vibrant center appealing to all ages and promoting the story of our immigrant ancestors.

The Wawel Dancers from Houston led the procession into the church for a Mass celebrated by Fr. Krzysztof Olejnik, Superior General of the Society of Christ Fathers, and Fr. Wieslaw Iwaniec, Pastor of the Immaculate Conception Parish. Following Mass, the crowd sat under a large tent set up at the entrance of the Polish Heritage Center and enjoyed the Wawel young dancers followed by the Wawel teen dancers.

The PHC then provided a BBQ lunch at the Panna Maria Diner. After lunch, participants were able to choose 4 activities out of 7 available during the afternoon. These included a Pierogi demonstration by Apolonia Catering chefs; Polish crafts, including Polish Flag making and Polish National Symbols provided by the IPN, Institute for National Remembrance, who sent two representatives from Poland: Marta Golinska and Beata Kopcinska; tours of the Center, tours of the St. Joseph Museum and a tour of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary Church.

Our participants included students from the Austin Polish School, the UT Austin Polish Club, the Houston Polish School, parishioners from Our Lady of Czestochowa in Houston, Texas A&M Polish Association, and the Dallas Polish School.

PHC Art Contest

The Center sponsored its annual Spring Art Contest, which is open to area schools. The themes are Polish art and culture, family life, farm life, and community. There were 130 entries and 41 awards presented at a reception April 5.

Scholarship Recipients

The Bishop Yanta Academic Scholarship is awarded to descendants of the 19th century immigrations to the Panna Maria area and the Brazos Valley. The 2025 Bishop Yanta scholarship has been awarded to Lauren Dziuk and Makayla Janysek. Lauren currently attends Texas A&M. Makayla will be attending Palo Alto College in San Antonio.

The newly created Polish Heritage Center Academic Scholarship is available for students from the more recent Polish immigrations to Texas. The 2025 PHC scholarships have been awarded to Kacper Fafara and Adam Przybylski. Both attend Blinn College.

Polish Cooking School – A Culinary Adventure

On four consecutive Wednesdays in June/July, the PHC opened its doors to twenty young chefs for its first cooking school. The youngsters, 3rd – 8th grades, learned the basics, like measuring ingredients and cracking eggs to the more advanced skills of rolling dough and making pierogi. They, with the help of brave and tireless adult guides, made Khruchiki, Katarzynki, fudge, apple croissants, pinwheels, Kompot, and of course pierogi. Special thanks to Chef Phillip from Apolonia Catering who led the pierogi class.

Professors from Lublin

On July 3, Dr. Jim helped facilitate the visit of Polish professors from Catholic University in Lublin to the PHC for presentations, a luncheon, and tours.

Bishop Yanta Celebration of Life August 16

On the third year since his passing, we gathered to celebrate the life of Bishop John Yanta with a Mass at Immaculate Conception Church in Panna Maria, followed by a graveside observance and a reception at the Polish Heritage Center.

Bishop Yanta Exhibit

For the past two years, the Polish Heritage Center staff have been working on an exhibit celebrating the life of Bishop, who made his mark in life both within and beyond the Church, from his early years in Runge to being the first descendant of the original Polish immigration to Panna Maria to be ordained a Bishop. The grand opening of the Bishop Yanta exhibit was held on Saturday, October 18.

Jubilee Year Assembly

On Oct. 25, Immaculate Conception Church in Panna Maria, a Jubilee Year Pilgrimage site, and the PHC hosted a Jubilee Year Assembly for the parishes in the Floresville Deanery and the surrounding area. More than 200 participants attended.

Panna Maria Historical Society

The PMHS has operated the Panna Maria Visitor Center for many decades in addition to recording volumes of PM history. They maintain the outstanding St. Joseph Museum on the grounds of the Immaculate Conception of the BVM church at Panna Maria. Visit their pretty website PannaMariaTexas.com.

St. Hedwig

Annunciation of the Blessed Virgin Mary Church, The parish annually holds Masses for the Polish American Priests Association. It is a beautiful Polish church in a rural farming and ranching setting. Many parishioners are descendants of the 1800s Polish/Silesian settlers. A large cemetery is on the grounds.

Kosciusko

St. Ann Catholic Church was built in 1898 following the establishment of a Polish school in 1892. Named for Polish General Thaddeus Kosciusko, the spelling is accepted in several ways. The parish's annual picnic is on the 1st Sunday in August. Parishioners include many descendants of original 1850s Polish/Silesian settlers. The parish maintains a cemetery, too.

Cestohowa

Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary Church is a beautiful church in the Polish tradition. Many parishioners are descendants of original 1850s Polish/Silesian settlers. The spelling has been adopted by parishioners. The cemetery is maintained by the parish.

Falls City

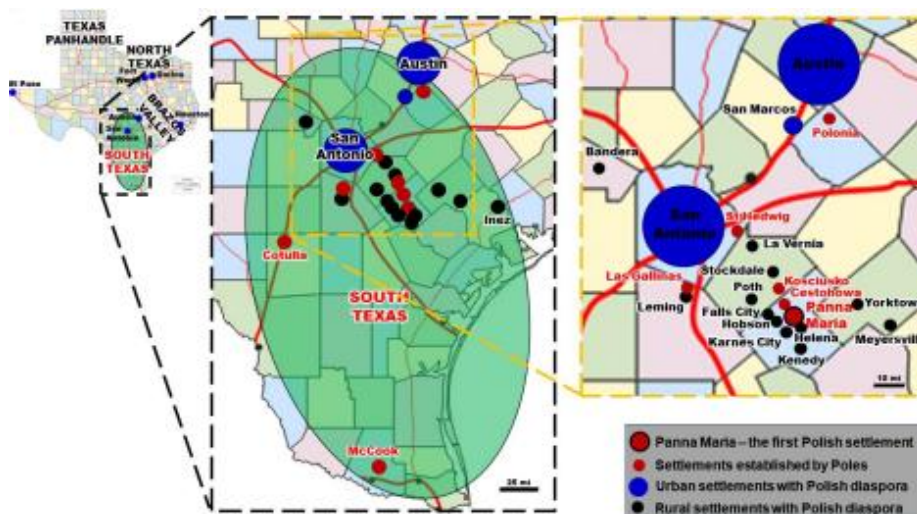
Holy Trinity Catholic Church has many parishioners who are descendants of the original 1850s Polish/Silesian settlers. The active parish holds a popular festival each year.

Yorktown

Holy Cross Catholic Church of Yorktown, today a large and thriving parish, was a mission of Meyersville, in 1866. For a short time in 1868, there was a resident pastor, Father John Frydychowitz, but again, it soon became Panna Maria's mission church. The founders were Polish families from villages in Upper Silesia, Poland, then under German rule. These early settlers arrived in Texas between 1854 and 1856.

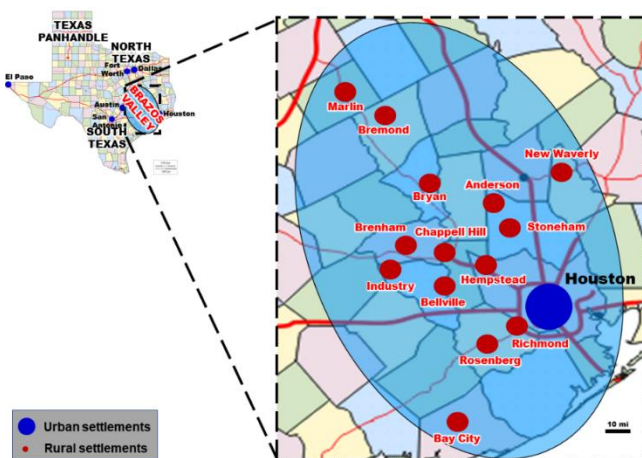

The Borderland Chopin Festival is a celebration of our love for this great and genius composer, keeping his art and patriotic spirit alive.

On Easter Saturday, April 19, members of GCPS, along with families and friends, gathered to bless food (Święconka) in a Catholic parish house. OMF Jarosław Wysoczanski blessed the traditional food baskets.

On June 1, we celebrated Children's Day with the children meeting at Orange Leaf for ice cream. A small talent show took place, and each child received a toy. From June 11 to 15, we participated in the Chamber Music Festival 2025, during which the outstanding violinist Teresa Grynia performed. We also celebrated a special distinction for Dr. and Dr. Sarosiek, who were featured in a TVP Polonia report titled "Scientific Success Abroad" for their pioneering work in the medical field. The Polish Club at UT is a leading Polish-American organization which promotes Polish culture, food, traditions, community, and language through a variety of Polish events and trips.

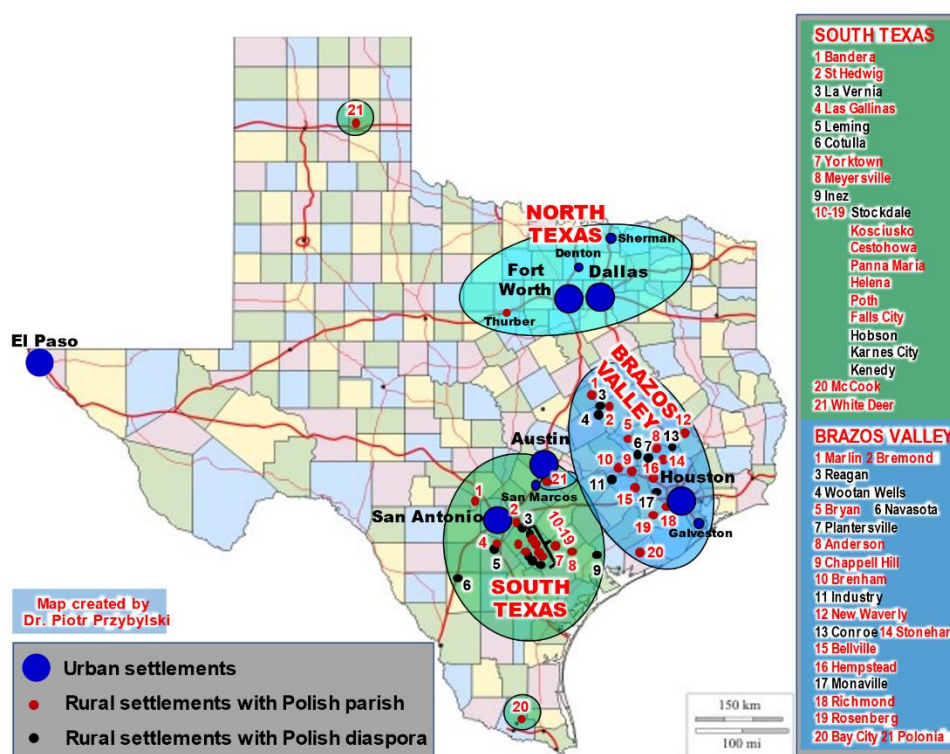
